The Center for Spiritual Living Capistrano Valley offers Community, Connection and Creativity

San Clemente, California (March 31, 2014) – Founded in 1968, the Center for Spiritual Living Capistrano Valley offers a community for spiritual seekers who believe that the universe has intelligence, purpose, beauty and order; and integrates spiritual tools, such as affirmative prayer, meditation and visioning, to provide a greater personal relationship with God.

"When God is the focus of our spirituality and we feel a deep and daily connection, then other areas of our lives fall into place," explained Rev. Heather Dawn Clark, senior minister for the Center. "We are happier and we can do more for others; this connection makes us better stewards of the Earth and brings peace and harmony to the world."

One of more than 450 Centers for Spiritual Living throughout the country, the Center teaches spiritual principles, such as cause and effect and the law of attraction, initially introduced by mystics thousands of years ago and recently proven by science and physics. This New Thought tradition dates to the 1880s and has its roots in the Transcendentalist Movement of the 1830s. New Thought has a respected and enduring legacy that includes luminaries such as Ralph Waldo Emerson, Walt Whitman and Ernest Holmes. Modern day writers and philosophers who echo the New Thought ideas include Wayne Dyer, Deepak Chopra, Marianne Williamson, Louise Hay and Eckhart Tolle among many others.

The Center Sunday Services

Wherever you are on your spiritual path, you are welcome at the Center on Sunday morning. At the beginning of each service, Clark leads the congregation in a candle lighting ceremony honoring all the great spiritual traditions of the world and, most importantly, the individual's unique path.

The Sunday morning service offers live music featuring weekly musical guest artists, a guided meditation, and an inspirational talk designed to provide personal insight for greater growth and expression. Monthly themes include authenticity, connection, finding balance, practice, self-worth, and abundance.

Sunday Youth Program

While adults enjoy an uplifting service in the sanctuary, children fill the youth center and have their own experience on Sunday. The youth center is guided and managed by Rev. Pattie Mercado, youth minister, and she, along with trained volunteers, provides age-appropriate lessons, inspiration, activities and connection for children, birth to 18 years old.

Our nursery/playroom has two teachers dedicated to caring for our infant through preschool children. The kinder through 3rd grade kids receive an experiential lesson based on God qualities and spiritual principle along with a fun craft and games. Preteens have their own space at the Center. Children, grades 4 through 8, participate in their own candle-lighting ceremony followed by discussion and expression through art or movement.

Lastly, our In-Flight teen group, for kids ages 12 to 18, meets on Sunday mornings and evenings for workshops, discussion and connection. Twice a year, our teen group unites with about 500 other Center for Spiritual Living teens from all over the country for winter and summer camp, a life-transforming and enriching experience.

Wednesday Wisdom

The Center offers a mid-week faith-lift service each and every Wednesday evening from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m. in the sanctuary. One of the Center's 11 assistant or staff ministers offers topics, insight and tools for transformation. This is an insightful and interactive service designed to strengthen community.
